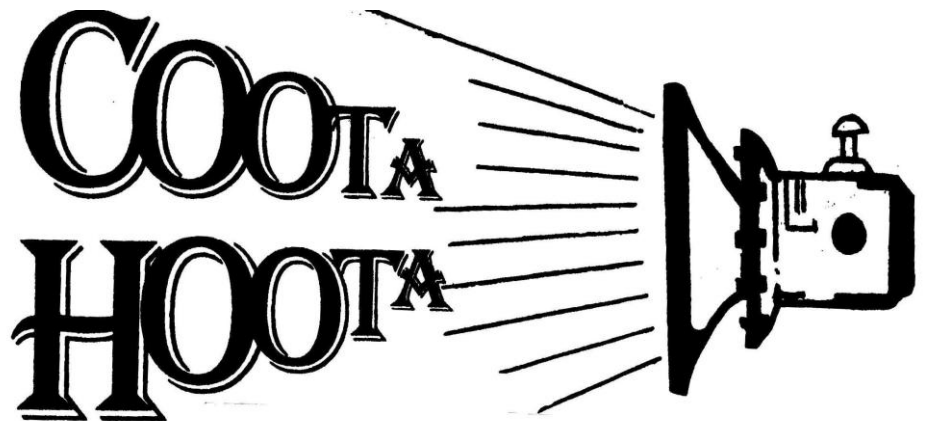
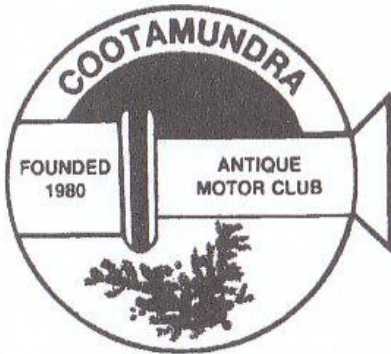

**FIRST
WE GO TRIPPING to The
Henry Lawson Festival -
Saturday 9 June, 2012
at GRENFELL.**

It was a lovely sunny morning in Cootamundra as the boys and I, in the A50, met Ken & Betsy Harrison in their Humber Super Snipe at Mowalls. We waited awhile, then set off on our journey to Grenfell.

At Grenfell there were many roads closed, which caused a few detours before we found our check-in point.

Then went and looked at the many stalls, where we bought jumpers and scarves.

At 1.30 we went in the huge PARADE.

The Austin purred along.

[BAD LUCK No. 1]

After parking our cars, the boys went on a jumping castle with slide, which at the bottom was not a pump-up section but like a foam rubber, which Liam, (12 yr old Grandson) hit

And broke his ankle. !!!

I then needed to get the Austin through the droves of people to collect him. A security guard hindered my rescue but I finally got Liam into the Austin.

We went to Grenfell hospital.

They organized an Ambulance -- Grenfell to Cowra for him. Nathaniel went with him for company.

I followed with the Austin. Grenfell to Cowra.

Liam had his leg X-rayed; . . . and put in plaster.

Complications to the broken ankle . . . he needs to go to Orange Hospital, via ambulance.

Nathaniel (Liam's twin) and I followed in the Austin. Cowra to Orange.

[BAD LUCK No.2]

1 km out of Blayney the A50 broke down at 10pm. (The Number plates have 303 in them -see photo - maybe I should have shot it, and put it out of its misery).

I ring the NRMA who arrives at 11pm and can't get the car going.

He rings for a tow truck.

I ring the hospital, to say what has happened, and hospital asks me a question, but phone goes dead. Ran out of battery .

The ambulance that had already dropped Liam off at Orange, stopped to see if we need blankets, or any other help, but we are all right. . . . ?

The tow truck arrives. A50 ("Rachel 2") is loaded on, and us.

And Nathaniel and I are dropped off, 1.30 a.m., at ORANGE Hospital. We find Liam in Emergency. We have no sleep until Liam is put into the children's ward at 6.30am. – Sunday. Then we have 2hrs sleep.

(And no-one has a charger that fits my phone.)

Husband Warren arrives Sunday afternoon in his ute. He brings phone charger, and one change of clothes. As I am there for a week, much hand washing was done.

Liam is operated on -- takes a two hour operation -- plate and screws.

Sunday evening Warren takes Nathaniel home to Cootamundra for school.

Tuesday, I ring the mechanic where Austin has been locked up. As he is a wrecker and mechanic, I ask him if he should wreck it or fix it

He rewired the coil. A50 goes. Next Saturday Liam and I - in the A50 -- purred home to Cootamundra.

Liam will need lots of visits back to Orange Hospital over the next few months.

OUR TRIP TO BUNDANOON.

Our A50 is called "Rachel 2". ("Rachel" was our previous A30.)

On the 23 June - We are off again in Rachel 2. Cootamundra to the Country Inn Motel at Bundanoon - for an overnight stay with people from The Austin Motor Vehicle Club of NSW. There were 16 cars, all AUSTINS -- A30s, A40 Devon, A50, A55, A105, Austin 1800, Austin Sheerline, and Austin Freeway.

The weekend was classed as the President's Run, which is held every year in different places.

It was a lovely day when we left Cootamundra, but the wind was cold at Bundanoon.

We also caught up with our nephew on our way to motel.

The Country Inn put on a delicious meal for Tea. And a cooked Breakfast.
